Assignments and Feedback	<ul> <li>☐ Have students upload documents for grading using the Blackboard Learn Assignment tool</li> <li>☐ Set up the Grades tool in your Blackboard Learn course site, and connect items to assignments &amp; rubrics</li> <li>☐ Have students submit video or digital recordings of their performances, presentations, or projects</li> <li>☐ Use rubrics to help grade assignments quickly — Blackboard Learn has a rubric tool for assignments uploaded</li> <li>☐ Provide digital (audio, video, or written) feedback on student assignments</li> </ul>
